JUNIOR SCHOOL

YEARS 7 & 8

Our aim in Junior School is to create an environment where students feel empowered to learn and achieve. Our teachers will prepare our Year 7 and Year 8 students to be healthy, positive, resilient learners who have the literacy, numeracy and personal and social capabilities required to achieve their best.

At Doncaster Secondary College, students in Years 7-10 gain a sound knowledge in each of the areas identified by the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority prescribed curriculum, the Victorian Curriculum. In our Junior School (Years 7 & 8), there are three learning focuses: **Literacy, Numeracy** and **Personal & Social Capabilities**. Our teachers will use various approaches to build, improve and extend these skills, coupled with the Victorian Curriculum Achievement Standards. Doing so supports students to succeed in all their subjects and prepare them for transition into Middle School.

MANAGING ME

Unique to Doncaster Secondary College, we provide the **Managing Me** Pastoral Care program to our Year 7 & 8 students. Meeting for 30 minutes several times a week, students will be supported with their transition to high school and develop connectedness with their peers. Managing Me is also a focused class on building Personal and Social Capabilities, such as emotional expression, resilience, empathy, an understanding of the importance of diversity, respectful relationships and teamwork.

At Doncaster Secondary College, we believe these skills are essential for students to maximise their learning growth and exhibit positive learning behaviours. Our most successful students in VCE are often the students who have strong organisation, resilience, empathy and the ability to handle challenging situations.

Year 7 Subjects:

MIDDLE SCHOOL

YEAR 9

Having consolidated the basics of Junior School, our Middle School students are looking for increasing independence and agency. Doncaster Secondary College will provide our year 9 students the learning opportunities they need to help them understand the world, how it works and how they can influence it.

At the same time, Year 9 students are preparing to enter Senior school, with its relentless pursuit of academic excellence, and that this is a year of transition and preparation for that all-important step. Attendance, effort, aptitude, achievement and growth are all closely monitored to ensure learners are achieving their full potential and setting themselves up for future success in a pathway suited to their individual interests, aspirations and skills.

Highly motivated students who excel in each of these areas in Year 9 will be eligible to complete a VCE Advancement or VET subject in their Year 10 program.





Year 9 Subjects:

English/English as an Additional Language, Mathematics/ Mathematics (Extension), Science Inquiry, Humanities, Health & P.E., Future Ready, MYSELF.

Semester-length electives: The Arts: Media, Drama, Music Performance, Music Technology & Production, Visual Arts - 2D, Visual Arts - 3D, Visual Communication and Design. The Technologies: Electronics, Food Technology, Woodwork, Digital Technology. Languages: Italian, Mandarin Chinese, French.

MYSELF PROGRAM

Uniquely, our College provides Year 9 students the opportunity to engage in both **Leadership Development** and **Design Thinking skills** as a way to contribute positively towards the community. Students select four electives that will develop their capabilities in meaningful decision-making, leadership, healthy risk-taking and real-world applications of learning.

Term-length electives: Leadership: My Future Leader, My Peer Leader, Duke of Edinburgh. Design Thinking, Entrepreneurship & Community: My Animal, My Business, My City Planning, My Coding, My Community, My Fitness, My Outdoor, My Product Design, My Urban Art.

ARE YOU FUTURE READY?

Doncaster Secondary College provides our Year 9 students a dedicated Careers Planning and Pastoral Care program, called **Future Ready**. In this subject, students will identify their personal strengths, undertake Morrisby profiling, build awareness of academic and vocational pathways, continue to develop personal and social capabilities, and activate the Year 10 subject selection process.







& BEYOND

YEARS 10 - 12

Students enter Senior school at a pivotal point in their learning journey. Before undertaking Years 11 and 12, we will ensure our students have the attributes to achieve their future goals. Our Year 10 program is defined by careers experience and course counselling. Our VCE program will deliver a high standard of academic tuition and allow students to pursue academic and vocational excellence.

VCE

With over 30 VCE subjects on offer at Doncaster Secondary College, our students have the opportunity to tailor a VCE program to suit their interests, talents and future pathways. High achieving students have the option of completing accelerated studies.

Year 10

Year 10 students undertake six subjects. In order to prepare students for the rigours of VCE or VCE-VM, our Year 10 program adheres to a model designed to create

a positive learning environment and support students to develop their study skills and personal best. A Year 10 Certificate is given to students who are able to meet the College expectations around attendance, behaviour and effort.

Year 11 & Year 12

Students normally undertake five subjects in Year 11 and five subjects in Year 12. Students following this pathway will benefit from an enhanced focus and deeper learning of their VCE subjects.

Accelerated VCE program

High-achieving students may be invited to undertake the Accelerated VCE Program where they have the option to complete a sixth VCE unit in a variety of ways. Students who demonstrate outstanding achievement in Year 11 also have the opportunity to undertake University Enhancement Studies or CHES programs as they enter Year 12.

Study periods are built into the VCE timetable and they are an opportunity to attend Masterclasses, Learning Catch Ups and are a dedicated time for assessments, which free up tuition time in regular classes.

VCE-VM

The VCE Vocational Major (VCE-VM) is a two-year vocational and applied learning program that enables students to transition into an apprenticeship, traineeship, further education or directly into employment. VCE-VM students have the option of adding a Vocational Education & Training (VET) course or a School-Based Apprenticeship (SBAT) to their study program.

To be eligible for the VCE-VM program at Doncaster Secondary College, students must have successfully completed Year 10, have met the minimum 90% attendance requirements and have completed a VCE-VM interview.

CAREERS PLANNING

The Doncaster Secondary College Careers Centre is a dedicated space in the Senior Centre where all students have access to Career Advisors and materials from tertiary institutions and industry. Strong career support is provided to students, including a weekly Careers Newsletter and access to the College Careers website. The Careers department will also work with students to prepare their individual **My Career Portfolio** which builds a Career Action Plan, stores their career and course resources and has access to useful links.

PERFORMING ARTS

Doncaster Secondary College has a reputation for a vibrant performing arts environment. From stirring instrumental music concerts to dynamic school productions, our students absolutely shine on stage.

MUSIC

Our Instrumental Music program strikes the perfect chord between comprehensive musical education and an enriching school experience. Tuition takes place conveniently during school hours in our dedicated Music Centre, ensuring seamless integration with our students' academic schedule. We offer tuition on a wide variety of instruments. Students will learn in small groups or receive private tuition if studying music at VCE level.

Joining our program means becoming a member of our esteemed College ensembles. From orchestras to jazz and rock bands, our ensembles offer boundless opportunities to showcase talent before live audiences.

Our Instrumental Music program welcomes students of all levels, including beginners. In fact, many of our passionate musicians embarked on their musical journey with no prior experience, discovering hidden talents and forging lifelong connections along the way.

DRAMA

Our school productions, meticulously crafted and delivered to a high quality standard, provide a platform for students to creatively express themselves and captivate audiences with their performances.

Beyond the spotlight, and for students preferring to work behind the scenes, they can participate in a myriad of opportunities to shine. From lighting and sound design, to prop creation and makeup artistry, all students can play a vital role in bringing our school productions to life. Students also delve into the realms of promotion and marketing, gaining valuable insights into the business side of the performing arts.

SPORT

At Doncaster Secondary College, sport goes beyond competition; it is a powerful vehicle for physical and mental wellbeing. Our programs are designed to embody and nurture our College values of Respect, Responsibility, Resilience and Teamwork.

Health and Physical Education is a compulsory subject in Years 7 to 9, and an elective subject in Senior school. All students are invited to participate in our vibrant intraschool sports events which include the athletics carnival, swimming trials and our cross country day. Our grounds transform into a kaleidoscope of colours as our Yarra, Kiewa, Ovens and Murray houses compete to earn points.

We also run a highly successful interschool sports program where our dedicated physical education teachers don't just provide training and coaching, they inspire our students achieve their best.

Sports Precinct


